Legal counsel provides guidance on contracts, liability issues, and governance practices, helping protect the chapter and its leaders from potential risks. They can also assist with fundraising regulations or event liability concerns. This expertise safeguards the chapter's reputation and ensures that decisions align with MSCI's antitrust.
